# FY 26 Budget

### Key Factors in Budget Increases – Inflexible Increases

- Proposed increase in health insurance rates 11.9% = approximately \$60,000
- Negotiated Salary Increases 9.9% plus step = approximately \$246,420
- Employer FICA tax increase 11.17% = approximately \$18,850
- Employer VMERS increase 0.25% = \$6,800
- VT State Teacher OPEB Payment Increase estimate = \$3500
- Act76 Childcare Tax 0.44% (Employer) increase 11% = \$1,000

The above list of increases makes up 99.95% of total increase.
